




## The Lyell Centre for Marine and Earth Science and Technology – *Vision*

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The Lyell Centre is a new and exciting strategic collaboration between the British Geological Survey (BGS) and Heriot-Watt University (HWU)

- The overarching objective of this new partnership is to develop and apply evidence-based solutions to global challenges associated with the Earth's surface, sub-surface, oceans, and atmosphere.
- Funders of the Lyell Centre include the Natural Environment Research Council (NERC), the Scottish Funding Council (SFC), and HWU.



The purpose-built £21m Lyell Centre facilities enable BGS and HWU to build on their individual and combined interdisciplinary expertise in fundamental and applied research.
